DEFINITION GUIDE FOR THE SET SUBJECTS 2022-23

TREES - 18th October

This subject is self-explanatory so why not think out of the box and photograph from a different viewpoint

STILL LIFE – 22ND November

An arrangement of objects, typically including fruit and flowers and objects contrasting with these in texture, such as bowls and glassware. Nowadays, a still life can be anything from an art impression to a vase of tulips styled like a Dutch Golden Age painting.

INSPIRED BY MUSIC – 13th December

Take an image related to a song title, for example, a photo of a yellow submarine. Music by the Beatles Yellow Submarine.

It is important when you title your entry on this subject to PLEASE include the name of the band or artist e.g. YELLOW SUBMARINE THE BEATLES by Your Name

WATER – 10th January

Once again this can be an array of images from water drops, waterfalls, rivers or sea. Try something new to wow us.

BUILDINGS – 31st January

This covers a wide area as in the name. A building is a structure with a roof and walls, could be a house, factory, shop or castle etc. something that is a permanent construction. Look around you and produce something outstanding.

NIGHT 21st February

Capturing images outdoors at night, between dusk and dawn.

ANIMALS – 28th March

A living thing that can move and eat and react to the world through its senses, especially of sight and hearing: Mammals, insects, reptiles, and birds are all animals. In ordinary use, animal means all living beings except humans: A lion is a wild animal, and a dog is a domestic animal.

ONE COLOUR - 18th April

An image where one colour stands out from all the rest, maybe colour pop or a photo made up with a shade of a single colour.
